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## Ten Week Course on the "Incident Process" Beginning at the University of Dayton

DAYTON, Mar. -- A special 10-week course on the "Incident Process" will begin at the University of Dayton Mar. 26, Prof. John B. Steinbruegge, director of specialized educational services at the University, announced today.

The "Incident Process," developed by Dr. Paul Pigors of the Mass-achusetts Institute of Technology, and successfully used by many organ-izations in recent years, is felt to be an effective training device for developing a supervisor's ability to cope with personnel problems, according to Prof. Steinbruegge.

The course will be given in 10 two-hour sessions, one night a week, on the campus through May 28. Prof. Lloyd Brenberger, acting chairman of the department of industrial engineering, will direct the program.
