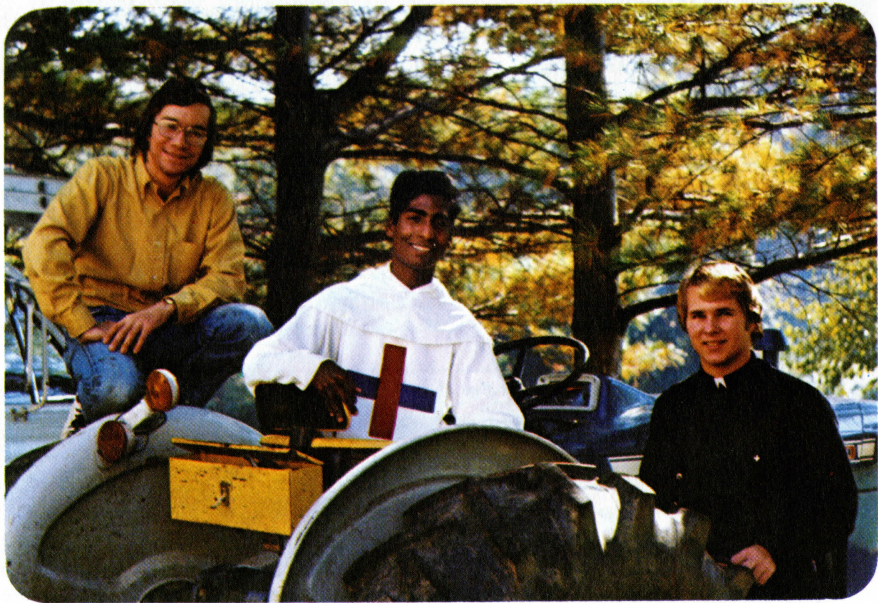



we have candles only you can light.*




You who have love
