Resolution to the Academic Senate

In light of recent events related to racial injustice on campus, the academic senate would like to express support of President Spina's quick response and solidarity with students of color. We are committed to working with President Spina, other faculty, staff, students, administrators, and alumni to ensure that campus is a space where every person is treated with dignity and respect and where our differences are embraced as a source of strength.
