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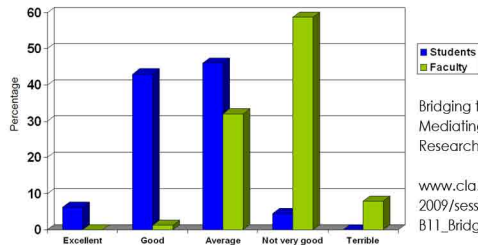

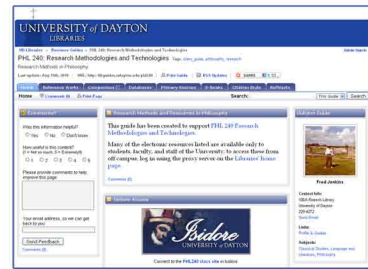

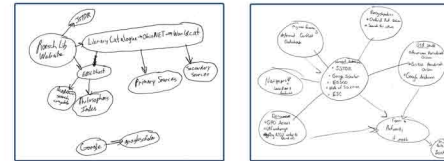

Student Learning Assessment

Using JSTOR, search only for **relevant** articles about William James and his philosophy. Show how you would exclude passing mentions of this topic.

Find an entry on Richard Rorty in the Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy. Within the secondary literature bibliography, identify a book and article citation. Does the library have a copy of the book? How will you get the article?

Cecil Rhodes was the 6th Prime Minister (1890-1896) of the Cape Colony in South Africa. British by birth, he was a strong believer in imperialism and colonialism. Find a relevant article from this time period that discusses his views.

Find a relevant U.S. government document about ethnic conflict in Ethiopia. Export the citation to RefWorks. Next, summarize any current armed conflicts in Ethiopia for the class using appropriate sources.
