THURSDAY, APRIL 23: UD HOSTS TAKE OUR DAUGHTERS TO WORK DAY

Girls will trade in their school bags to try their hand at injection molding as they accompany their parents to work at the University of Dayton for national Take Our Daughters To Work Day on Thursday, April 23.

In a workshop presented by the chemical engineering department, girls will learn how to make plastic key chains using an injection molding process that is used to make plastic cutlery and plastic car parts. The workshop, designed to show participants what a career in engineering can encompass, will be held from 10 to 11 a.m. in Wohlleben Hall room 14.

The workshop is one of many being presented by different departments at UD. Topics will also include economics, biology, languages, women's health, Web page development and merchandising.

Other interesting workshops on the schedule:

- 10 - 11 a.m. — UD's rescue squad will teach basic safety tips and show what it's like to be an EMT. The demonstration will take place outside Gosiger Hall.
- 1:30 - 2:15 p.m. — Students will see the "behind the scenes" working of a bookstore at the UD Bookstore. They will get a hands-on experience in retail.

Approximately 100 University of Dayton alumni, students, their families and friends will meet at 7:30 a.m. Saturday, April 25, in the Kennedy Union food court (lower level) for a continental breakfast before heading into Dayton for a morning of community service.

Beginning at 8:30 a.m., volunteers will depart from UD for 10 community service projects, including:

- Habitat for Humanity, three houses on the 1500 block of Roosevelt Ave. (one block north of Miami Chapel Road). Volunteers 13 and older will help with the local chapter's building project.
- Ronald McDonald House, 741 Valley St. University of Dayton volunteers will help with outdoor spring cleaning at the house that serves as home for the families of children who are patients at Children's Medical Center.
- Cheers program at St. Francis Church, 6245 Wilmington Pike. Volunteers will help young people with developmental disabilities in their arts and crafts activities.
- Edgemont Solar Garden, 1199 Wildwood. UD volunteers will join residents of the Edgemont neighborhood in transplanting and assembling decorative plants for the spring.

Additional projects will be held at Catholic Social Services, Southern Dayton View, Daybreak, WalkAmerica, Five Rivers Metroparks and Building Bridges.

Alumni will meet back on campus at 1:30 p.m. in Kennedy Union for a luncheon on the second-floor terrace. UD Community Service Day '98 is sponsored by the Dayton chapter of the National Alumni Association.
