JUNE 22-26: MYSTERIES ARE SOLVED DURING UD SUMMER LAUREATE PROGRAM

Solving mysteries, building bridges and cooking Japanese food are just a few of the activities of the Summer Laureate program June 22-26 at the University of Dayton.

About 115 gifted students, from grades three to eight, were selected from schools across the Miami Valley. The program will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. each day.

Some of the activities include:

- To the Moon and Back — For grades 3-5, participants will explore the principles of aerodynamics and flight with a simulated launch demonstration from 10 to 11 a.m. daily in Kennedy Union Room 331.
- Mysteries for Group Detectives — Third- and fourth-grade students will use clues to solve mysteries from 12:35 to 1:50 p.m. daily in the Kennedy Union Ballroom and Room 211.
- Bridges Over Ohio — Participants in grades 4-6 will build different types of bridges and learn why different design styles are used in different situations from 12:35 to 1:50 p.m. daily in Kennedy Union Room 311.
- Cooking Around the World — Participants will explore the historical and cultural background and flavors of food from Japan. Three sessions, 8:40 to 9:45 a.m., 10 to 11 a.m. and 12:35 to 1:50 p.m., will be held daily in Kennedy Union Room 253.
- Readers Theater — After watching presentations by a musician, story teller and dancer, Laureate participants will write and perform their own skits from 11:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. Friday, June 26, in the Kennedy Union Ballroom.
