

AUG. 10: SWEAT AMERICORPS ANNUAL LUNCHEON AT SINCLAIR COLLEGE

The fourth annual SWEAT AmeriCorps appreciation luncheon will be from noon to 1:30 p.m. Monday, Aug. 10, in Sinclair Community College's Charity Earley Auditorium (Building 12).

Lunch is from noon to 12:30 p.m. followed by a recognition ceremony for SWEAT participants. This year Congressman Tony Hall will present certificates to members of the 1997/98 "Season of Service."

SWEAT stands for Service With Energy and Talent and is a University of Dayton-administered project of AmeriCorps, which was created in 1994 by the Clinton Administration. Touted as a "domestic Peace Corps," the program places participants in underserved urban neighborhoods. Service can involve everything from tutoring at local schools to helping physically clean up the neighborhood.

In exchange for service, members receive a living allowance of about \$8,000, health insurance and a \$4,725 educational subsidy that can be used for college tuition or to pay off student loans.

"The neighborhood focus has been successful in that we've been able to move out of neighborhoods as they've matured and the leadership in them has crystallized," said Brother Ed Zamierowski, S.M., director of the program. "We've then been able to move on to other neighborhoods and work with them."
