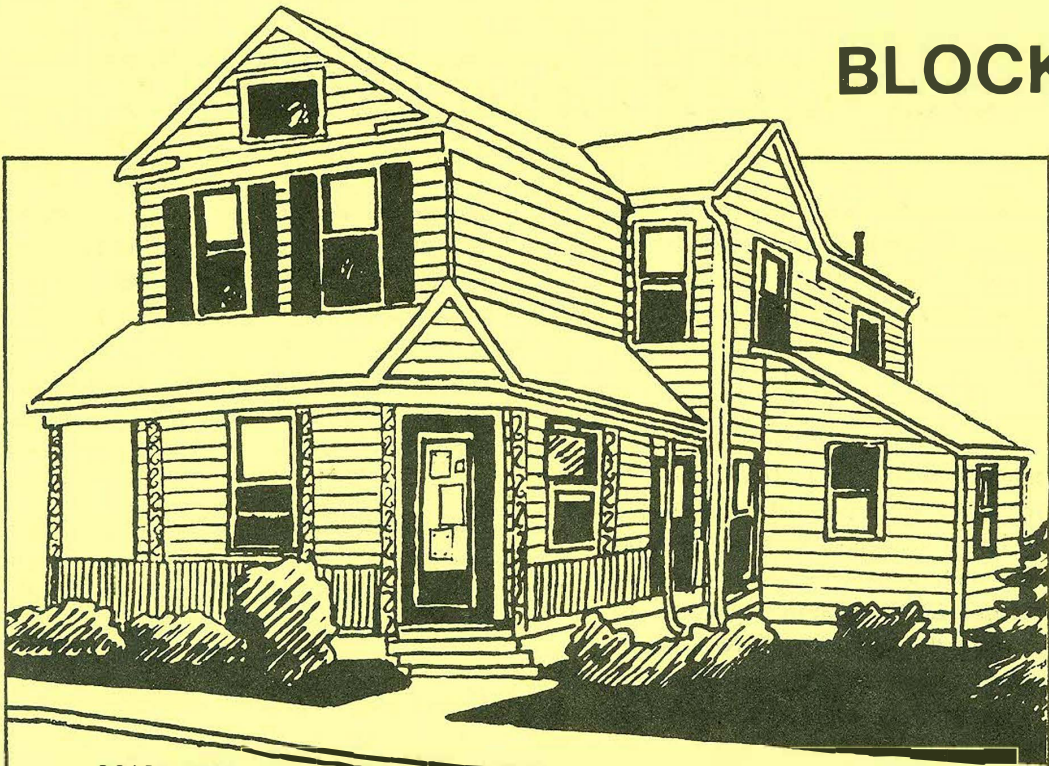

SUMMERTIME EVENTS

Find yourself bored occasionally? Just sitting around trying to come up with a more constructive way to relax? Here are just a few of many activities happening in the Dayton area this summer that you may want to remember:

Orpheus Film Series. . . **Orpheus**, the UD literary magazine, is sponsoring a *free* weekly series of classic films starting May 16th and running through July 25th. Films such as Renoir's **Rules of the Game**. Ingmar Bergmann's **Shame**, the original (1922) **Nosferatu** and Stanley Kubrick's **Dr. Strangelove** will be screened in O'Leary Auditorium. Concerts. . . Free weekly concerts are given at the *Island Park Bandshell* (in Island Park on Helena St.) featuring classics, jazz, country and western and pop styles. Free.

The **Cloister Concerts** at the Dayton Art Institute provide an intimate, courtly renaissance atmosphere with presentations of dance, drama and music. Call 223-5277 for more information. Free.

The **City of Kettering** sponsors weekly concerts at Fairmont West beginning June 4th. The concerts are held in the high school's amphitheater and feature local musical groups. Call 296-2400 for more information. Free.

Courthouse Square. . . offers daily activities at noon downtown. Art shows, music, exhibits and other entertainment are scheduled this year. Evening activities are also scheduled, such as the first "Affair at the Square" on Friday, May 16th sponsored by WING radio. Call 225-4806 for recorded schedule of events.

Cincinnati Reds. . . play home games at Riverfront Stadium. Ticket prices range from \$4.50 to \$7.50. Call their Dayton ticket office at Rike's for scheduled dates.

King's Island. . . is a great place to spend a day and relax. The park, located off I-71 at King's Mill (near Mason, Ohio) is open 7 days a week now through Labor Day. Gates open at 9 a.m. and admission is \$10.50.

The Arcade. . . is open again downtown. Across 3rd Street from the Courthouse Square, the 1902 Arcade houses a variety of shops, restaurants and vendors beneath a 90 foot glass dome.

Dayton International Festival. . . at Convention Center, downtown. Foods, crafts, and folk music of many nations will delight the visitor to this year's festival. The festival begins Friday, May 30th from 5 - 10 p.m., and continues Saturday from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Tickets are \$1.50 for adults in advance and \$2.00 at the door. Advance tickets can be purchased at Sears downtown, Dayton Mall and Salem Mall.

Riverbend Art Center. . . . at 142 Riverbend (off Riverside Drive between downtown and the Helena Street Bridge) will hold its annual **Art In The Park** on May 24 and 25 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. on the Art Center grounds. There will be displays and demonstrations of arts and crafts, including ceramics, painting, jewelry construction and stained glass, as well as music and refreshments. Admission is free.

Carillon Park. . . . houses many displays and exhibits in historic buildings. Transportation vehicles, from an antique Wright Brothers bicycle and bi-plane, Conestoga wagon, luxury rail-car to an elaborate Dayton-Stoddard automobile are the main features. Also included are Newcom's Tavern (Dayton's oldest standing building) full of pioneer artifacts, a pioneer schoolhouse and similar structures. Tours are offered. Admission is free. Park hours: Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. - 8:30 p.m., Sunday 1 p.m. to 8:30. Closed on Mondays unless it's a Monday holiday.

Carillon Concerts. . . . Every Sunday, from June through October, at 7:00 p.m., concerts featuring the Carillon and Celestron may be enjoyed within the park itself. Admission is free.

Dayton Air Fair. . . . will be held at Dayton International Airport in Vandalia July 18th through 20th. The Air Fair will begin Friday the 18th with a trade show. Saturday and Sunday, the 19th and 20th, actual air shows will feature aviation skills. The Air Force is sending the Blue Angels and Canada is sending the Snow Birds. The Army's Golden Eagles will also participate. General admission is \$3.00 in advance and \$4.00 at the gate. Reserved pavilion seating is available at \$10.00. A parking fee of \$1.00 will be charged. For more information, call 898-5901.
