## 2017 Summer MCAT Review Course at UC COM

University of Cincinnati College of Medicine offers an intensive summer course designed for students preparing to take the MCAT. This course will provide review of the main concepts in each MCAT content area, assist students with applying the concepts to the MCAT test questions, and help students utilize proper strategies for each MCAT test section. Registration is on-line and open to students from any college or university.

Evening lectures will be held at the UC COM from May 6 to June 24. On-line access to recorded lectures, in-class materials, and instructor communications through a google drive account provides the flexibility to review course content outside of class time.

## Hospital Elder Learning Program (HELP) available summer and fall

The Premedical Programs Office is partnering with Miami Valley Hospital (MVH) to offer a clinical experience working bedside with elderly patients in the Hospital Elder Life Program (HELP) with the goal of improving the patients' overall prognosis. Students will gain training in volunteer intervention programs, complete a minimum of sixty patient contact hours, and gain invaluable insight into hospital inpatient services. Students will be registered for MED 220 and earn academic credit in addition to fulfilling the prerequisite clinical experience for the capstone MED 480 course. Sixteen hours of training have to be completed prior to volunteering in the summer or fall session. Pick one of the sessions listed below. Students have the option of taking the summer course for zero credit to avoid paying summer tuition fees.

Thank you to all for participating in our annual healthcare symposium. This year's theme was "Building a Healthy Dayton: next steps." The morning presentations began with a health assessment of the Dayton community presented by the Dayton and Montgomery County Public Health Commissioner, Jeff Cooper, MS and Jessica Saunders, MPA from Dayton Children's Hospital. Local presentations that followed highlighted programs that focus on addressing the health challenges facing our community, ranging from infant mortality to the opioid epidemic. Our keynote speaker, Nick Buettner from the Blue Zones group, discussed their work in identifying common factors shared across communities identified as "Blue zones," where people live longer, healthier lives. The poster session featured work from current premed and prenent students as part of their capstone experience. Poster topics ranged from healthcare policy and delivery to biomedical research and reflections on clinical experiences. The afternoon student symposium hosted several speakers, including UD alumni, who shared their experiences and insight on discussion panels ranging from life in health professional school to careers in specific areas of health care.
