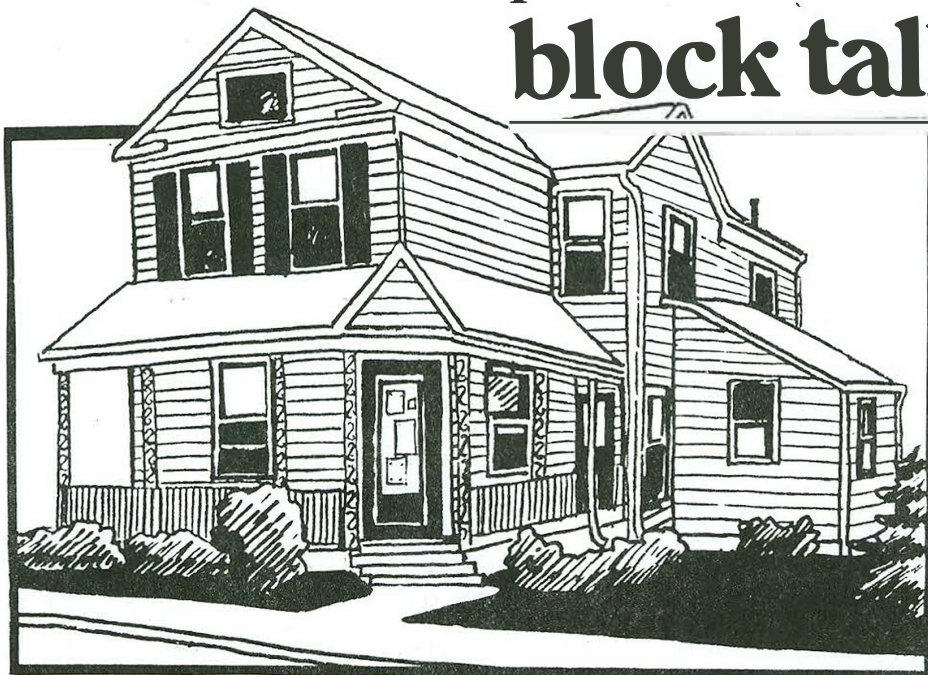

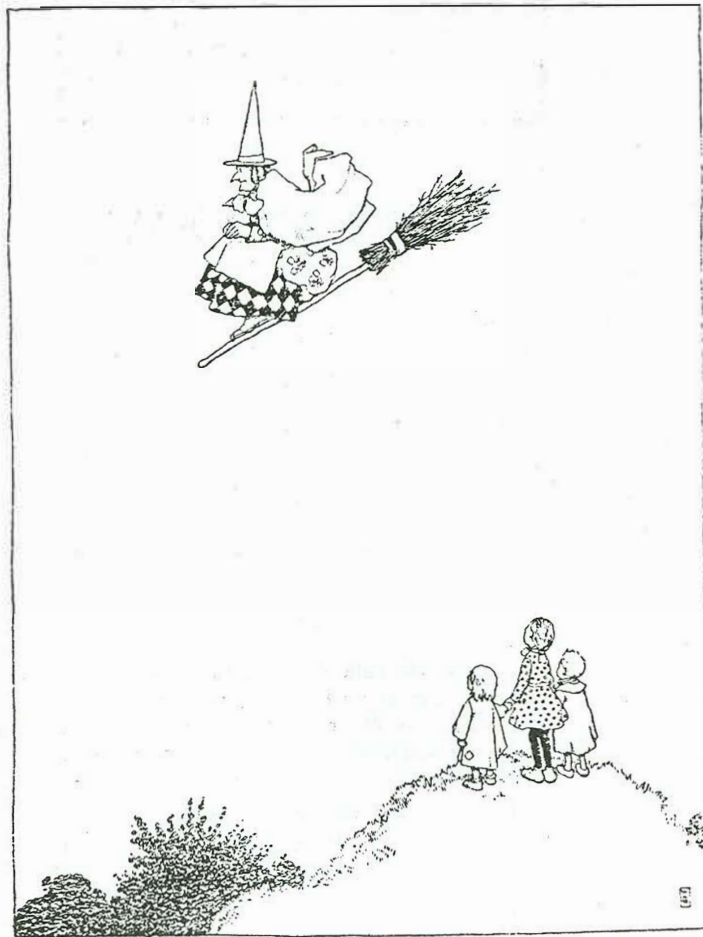
If you and your neighbors would like to form a watch group, call the Off Campus Center at 229-2047. It's another way to keep yourself from being ripped-off.

CITY OF DAYTON

WASTE COLLECTION INFORMATION

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

WASTE DEFINED includes wrapped garbage, paper, rags, grass, leaves, acceptable tree trimmings, wood (small), cans, bottles, and small metal items.

BURNABLE & NONBURNABLE waste can be placed in same container, but all materials must be containerized for positive service.

FREQUENCY OF COLLECTION - Weekly. Collections - Monday through Friday.

CONTAINERS. Approved metal or plastic containers with handles and close fitting lids must be used to contain waste. Maximum capacity is 32 gallon - minimum container acceptable is 10 gallon. Plastic containers must resist fracturing at temperatures of 32° F and lower. Incinerators, as such, are not acceptable containers and will not be emptied. The contents of incinerators present a fire hazard to collection equipment. Tubs, wire baskets and 55 gallon drums are not acceptable. Wood baskets can be used for seasonal storage of leaves and grass, but will be picked up with the contents when they reach sub-standard condition. Wooden baskets cannot be used for storage of other materials. Use of quality plastic bags acceptable for grass and leaves. If used for other materials, such bags to be presented at curb or alley on collection day only. If torn or ripped, they may not be removed.

Wooden and cardboard boxes, crates, paper bags or paper maché barrels are NOT acceptable containers and will NOT be removed if wet and impossible to handle. Such materials should be broken down and tied into bundles - 18" x 48". City assumes no responsibility if household wastebaskets are used.

CONTAINER LOCATIONS. Containers must be placed at curb or alley line for pick up. If location questionable, decision will be made by route supervisor. If no curb, container should be at edge of street. Containers should be out by 7:00 A.M. Containers in garages, sheds, on porches, back of fences or in yard at positions other than indicated above will not be serviced.

TREE LIMBS - SHRUBBERY - WOOD SCRAPS. Such material should not exceed 2 inches in diameter or 4 feet in length and be tied securely in bundles not more than 18 inches in diameter.

BUSINESS AND APARTMENTS

Small business and commercial establishments will be serviced. City reserves the right to decide on size and type of organization to be served. Industrial and manufacturing plants will not be serviced. All materials must be in approved containers and/or properly prepared. Maximum of 3 approved type containers allowable per business. Industrial waste or by-products will not be picked up.

COLLECTING WASTE IS A BIG JOB

The Waste Collection service of the City of Dayton requires the use of approximately 160 persons and 40 trucks. The job means daily non-stop operation (including most holidays). Trucks make 66,000 stops each week, and travel over 465,000 miles a year—rain or shine—Monday through Friday.

YES...IT'S A BIG JOB FOLLOWING THE RULES WILL HELP US SERVE YOU

Waste is taken to the County Incinerator. Limitations on type, size, and quantity are governed by incinerator regulations.

SORRY...we cannot accept the following: dirt, gravel, brick, rock, concrete, products, etc.

BULK ITEMS. Refrigerators, stoves, water heaters, washing machines, dryers, auto parts (bodies, fenders, hoods, seats, bumpers, motors, transmission, etc.), bed springs, metal beds, spring contained furniture, fencing or posts, 55 gallon drums, etc. will be removed upon request. Call 225-5324.

DON'T OVERLOAD CONTAINER. Combined weight of any approved container cannot exceed 75 pounds. Keep it covered. This will help keep litter off your premises, streets and alleys. It also will discourage rats and flies and will prevent frozen contents in winter.

TIME. For assurance of pick up, have your refuse out no later than 7:00 a.m. on day of collection.

GARBAGE PREPARATION. Drain and wrap in heavy paper, sacks or newspaper. (Wrapped garbage does not rust the containers. It also is more sanitary and helps control odor. Clean your container periodically). Put two tablespoons of ammonia in plastic bags for dog repellent.

CONTAINERS. Bottomless and illegal containers keep us from serving you and you from being served. Bottomless or sub-standard containers MUST be removed.

DOGS. If waste is to be collected, dogs must be confined or kept on a leash (away from containers) for your protection and the safety of our personnel.

LOST ARTICLES. It is important that you do not place articles of value on or next to waste containers. It is almost impossible to recover lost articles thrown into waste. The City cannot assume responsibility in such cases.

COURTESY. Our employees are instructed to be courteous. They, in turn, will appreciate your cooperation and consideration.

CONSTRUCTION WASTE. Sorry...we will not collect waste or rubble resulting from building repairs, construction, or demolition.
