The University of Dayton's board of trustees at its spring meeting on Friday, May 19, is expected to give its formal stamp of approval on more than \$20 million of campus renovations — a \$16.9 million addition to and renovation of UD's science complex and a \$3.8 million conversion of the Children's Center into an early childhood education learning demonstration school. UD broke ground on the Children's Center expansion last month.

Paul Morman, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, is available from **1:15 to 2 p.m.** on **Friday, May 19,** to show architectural renderings and talk about the enlargement and renovation of Sherman and Wohlleben Halls, UD's two science buildings. He will meet with reporters in room 110A in O'Reilly Hall.

In addition, trustees will tour the newly constructed \$6.75 million Lawnview Apartments at the corner of Lawnview Avenue and Lowes Street, between **12:45 and 1:15 p.m.** The four-story brick building in the south student neighborhood will house 165 juniors and seniors beginning in August and help accommodate a surge in undergraduate enrollment. This is the third straight year UD has received record applications for its first-year class, prompting officials to create a waiting list.
