

The Maryknoll Sisters' beginnings go back to 1912. Seven young women, led by Mary Josephine Rogers (later Mother Mary Joseph) banded together in Hawthorne, N.Y. to dedicate their lives to mission.

Rooted in the intimate love of God, they attracted many others and began works on the West Coast with the Japanese. They later expanded to China, the Philippines, Korea and Japan. In the 1940's missions were opened in Latin America and Africa.

Today—over 1,000 women, Maryknoll Sisters from 17 nations go forth as signs of God's loving presence in the world.
