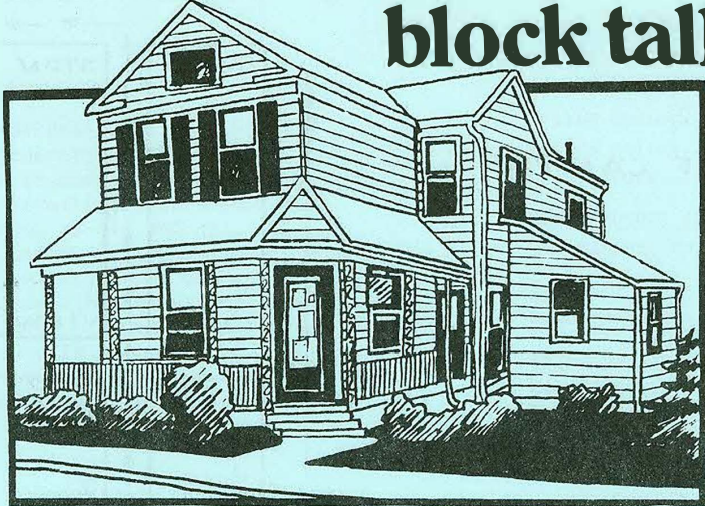

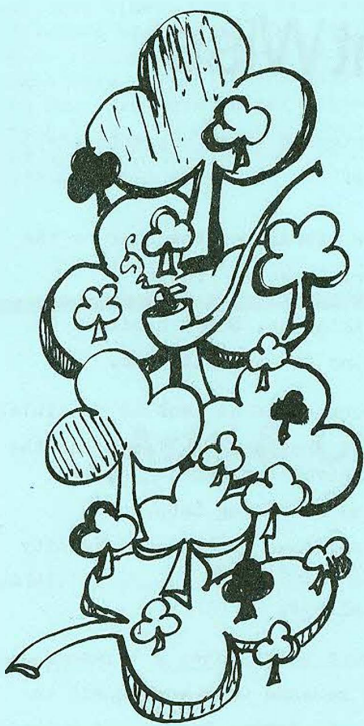

FIRST ANNUAL ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

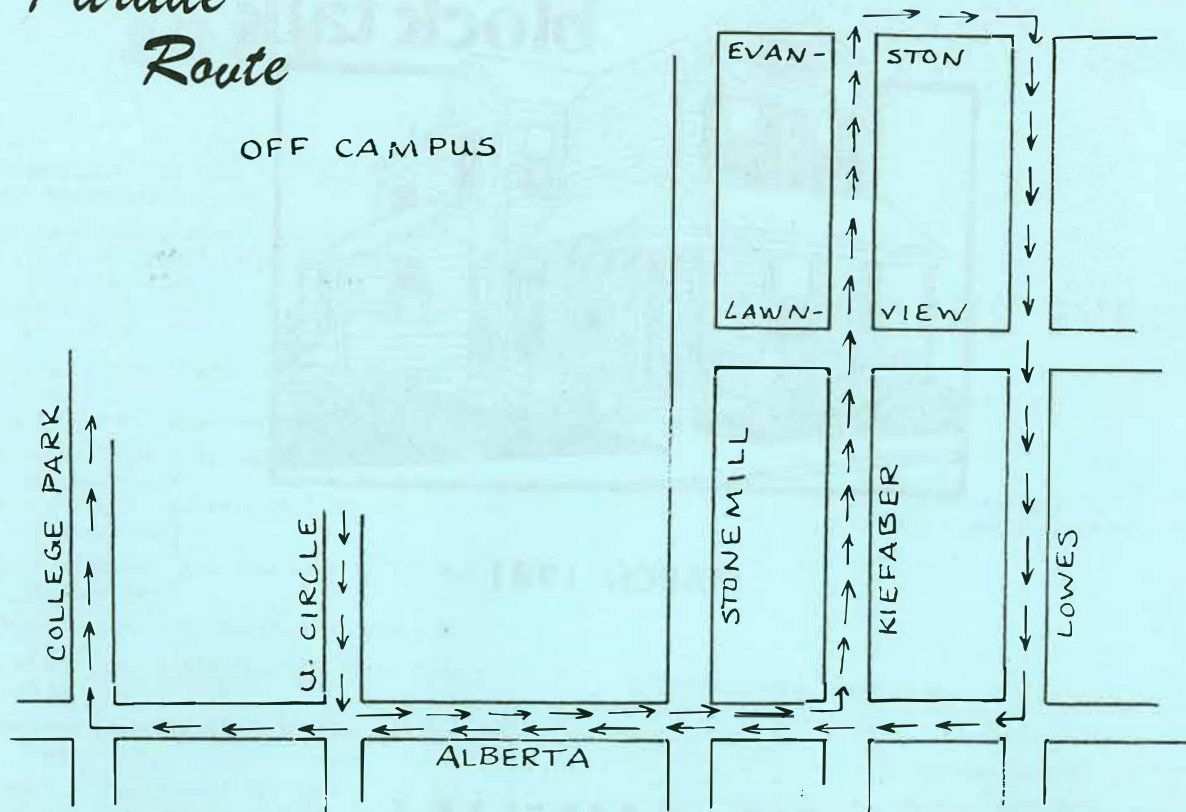


On Saturday, March 14th, the University community will enjoy its First Annual St. Patty's Day Parade. The parade is sponsored by the Irish Club and it begins at 2:00 p.m. It's route is 2.7 miles long including the campus and off campus areas (see map of parade route). The parade will start at Parking Lot E and continue through campus, then progress through the student residential area and return to the campus, ending up in "E" lot again around 3:00 p.m. when the Jaycees start their party.

The parade will include many different organizations including bagpipers from Cincinnati, Irish dancers, antique cars, bands from U.D. and Chaminade-Julienne and Alter High Schools. Floats will be made by many of the student organizations on campus and these will be judged by a panel of judges in front of the Off Campus Center. Prizes and trophies will be awarded for the most creative, the most Irish-theme oriented and the best over-all floats.

If you park your car on one of the streets along the parade route, we ask you to remove it to another parking area for the afternoon event.

WRITER'S WORKSHOP

PAPER DRIVE

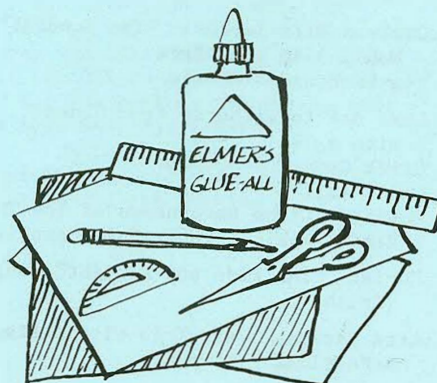

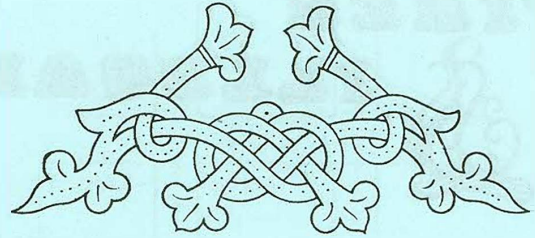
