SATURDAY, JULY 1: UD JAZZ CAMP STUDENTS FEATURED IN FREE CONCERTS

Nearly 140 jazz students will take the stage in an afternoon of free and public concerts beginning at 1:30 p.m. Saturday, July 1, on the plaza in front of the Jesse Philips Humanities Center at the University of Dayton. The concerts are the final activity for Midstates Jazz Summer Camp 2000 taking place on campus. Willie Morris III, assistant professor of music at UD and an artistic director for the camp, said he expects 10 to 20 large and small ensembles to perform a variety of jazz styles.

Midstates Jazz Summer Camp 2000 is a joint venture by the University and Miami Valley Jazz. The camp is open to all middle and high school, college and adult music students, regardless of skill level.

A strong cast of more than 25 professional jazz artists and instructors, featuring Carl Allen, Mulgrew Miller, Cecil McBee, Don Braden, Terell Stafford, Conrad Herwig and Bruce Arnold, are serving as camp faculty and will direct Saturday's concerts.
