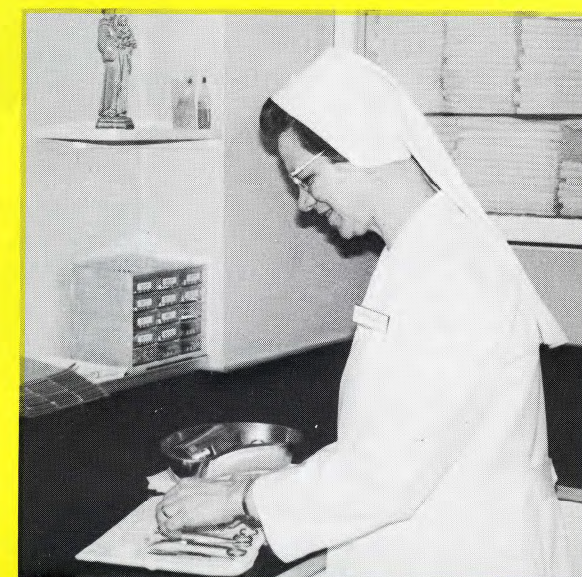
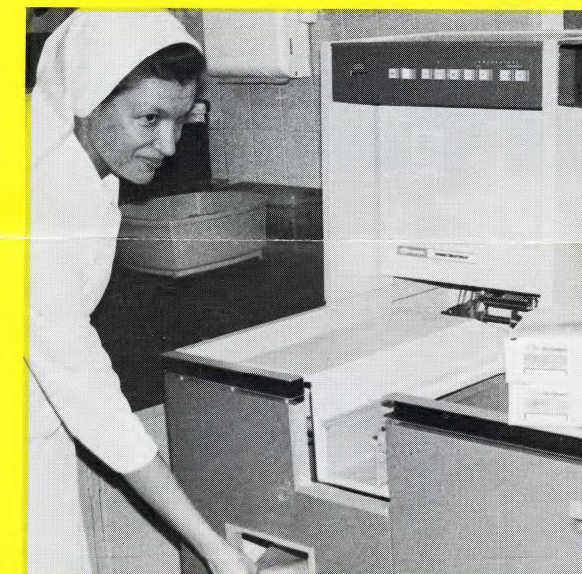
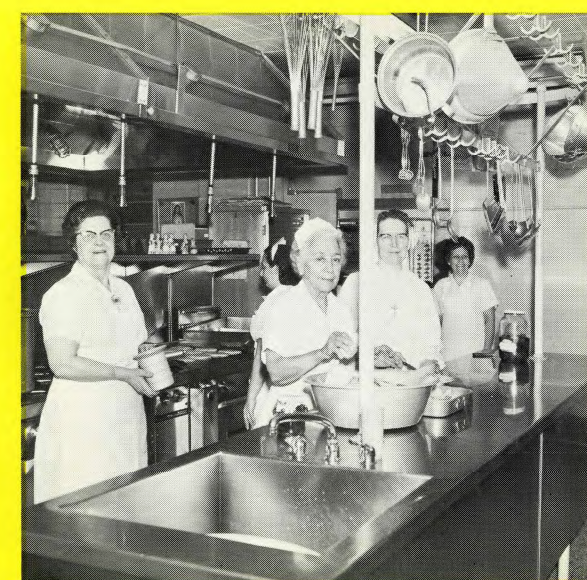
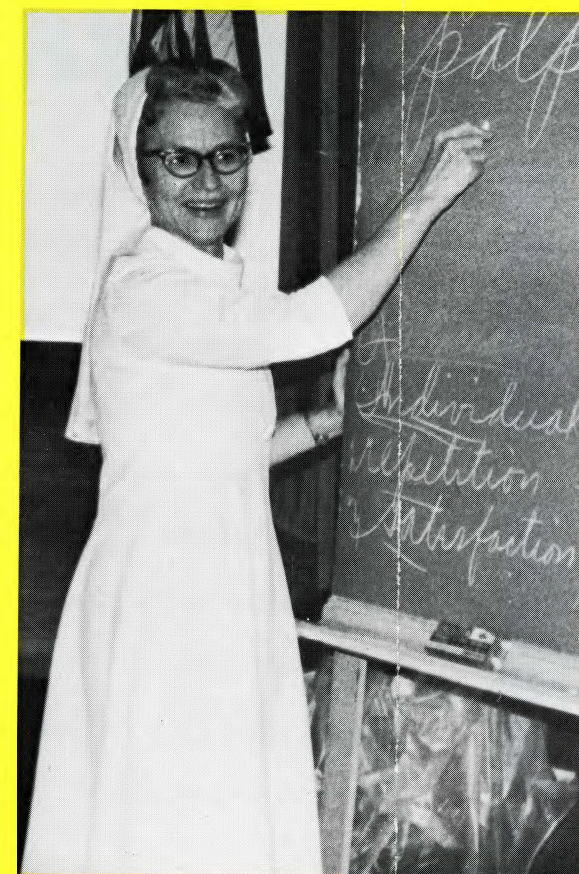
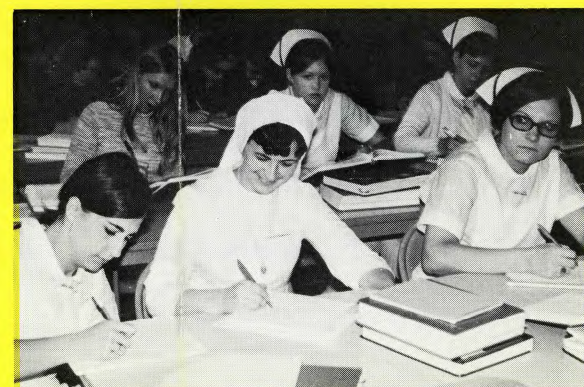
The Sister in the health field
