## What is Web Archiving?

The process of collecting, preserving, and providing enduring access to web content

## **Student Learning Outcomes**

- Learn that taking pride in one's community also means actively working to preserve history on the Internet
- Act as citizen archivists by selecting a webpage that supports the <u>common good</u> to archive using the <u>Internet Archive's</u> <u>Wayback Machine</u>

"Each person is interested in different things, and so the websites archived by institutions will be different from the websites archived by the general public."

### **Tutorial**

- Co-curricular learning opportunity
- Used <u>LibWizard</u> to create self-guided, asynchronous <u>tutorial</u>
- Incorporated videos, readings, and formative assessment to explain efforts to preserve websites
- Students chose a website to archive using the <a href="Internet Archive's "Save Page Now"">Internet Archive's "Save Page Now"</a> feature
- Students learned about the Internet's impermanence and gained knowledge to pursue their own citizen web archiving
