

Dayton Habitat for Humanity recognized the University of Dayton at a ceremony on Jan. 19 for its work building homes for those in need. The University received one of three President's Volunteer Service Awards. Representatives from the University accepted the Silver Award, which is given to groups completing between 500 and 999 service hours in a calendar year. Last year, 165 individuals from UD volunteered a total of 781 hours with Dayton Habitat. That total includes hours completed by: faculty, staff, and students through the student-run Habitat for Humanity club; other University volunteer groups that completed Habitat volunteer projects; and individual volunteer work by UD community members.


