The schedule for the Masses, which will be held in the Immaculate Conception Chapel on campus: 10 a.m., noon, 6 p.m., 8 p.m. and 10 p.m. There also is a Mass at 9 p.m. at McGinnis Center on campus.   |
| <u>Monday, Jan. 15</u>  | 10:45 a.m.  | A rally and march is planned. Participants will depart from Gosiger Hall starting at 10 a.m. They will be driven to the Montgomery County Fairgrounds, where they will join in a city-wide rally at 10:45 a.m. and a march to Courthouse Square beginning at 11 a.m..  |
|                         | 1 to 4 p.m. | After the march, UD faculty, students and staff will volunteer at the African-American museum at Wilberforce University where they will hand out "peace" buttons; Mercy Sienna Woods, 235 W. Orchard Springs Drive in Dayton, to talk and play games with residents of the nursing home; and Camp Fire boys and girls organization, 211 S. Main St. in Dayton, where they will tutor children. |
