Featured Marianist Mission

Another recipient of money collected for Marianists abroad this Lent will be Marianist Sisters' Health Clinics in Kpachile, Togo, West Africa and Singhpur, Jharkhand, India. Chaminade Health Care Center in India was dedicated in September 2012 to serve the students and families of the rural parish and the Marianist School. In October 2011, the Marianist Sisters opened a Rural Health Care Center in Kpachile, Togo outside of Kara. Part of its mission is to provide maternity and well-baby care for people who previously had no medical assistance. The Sisters need help raising Sr. Ann Martine's salary and that of the other medical personnel who serve the rural poor.

Miryam Award Recipients

The Miryam Award Committee has selected Debra Monk and Corrine Witherspoon for this year's recipients of the Miryam Award. These two individuals exemplify the spirit of the Miryam Award and are great role models for demonstrating how to transfer personal passion into effective, positive social change.

Debra Monk is the Associate Dean of Students and Director of Community Standards and Civility. Debra is also the coordinator for the C.A.R.E Team (Campus Awareness, Response and Evaluation). She has made huge strides in protecting the rights of victims involving sexual violence on campus. She has been co-chair for the Annie T. Thornton Women's Leadership Conference for two years, serves the commission for Housing and Residence Life for American College Educators International, in which she was a founding member of their social justice education commission, and is currently serving as the awards committee chair for the Association of Student Conduct Administrators.

Corrine "Cee Jay" Witherspoon is a Community Coordinator for the South Student Neighborhood. Corrine has enhanced the climate for women on campus by implementing the Sister Circle in the fall of 2011. The Sister Circle was started in response to the need to help women of color to connect with our community. The organization's purpose is to, "Encourage the promotion of sisterhood among African American/Black students, staff and faculty" (Sister Circle Review 2012). Since 2011, Corrine has positively influenced the lives of over 20 women, translating into their personal and academic success.

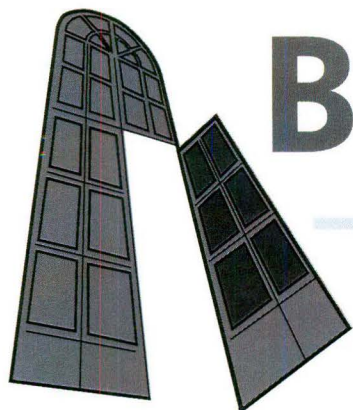
