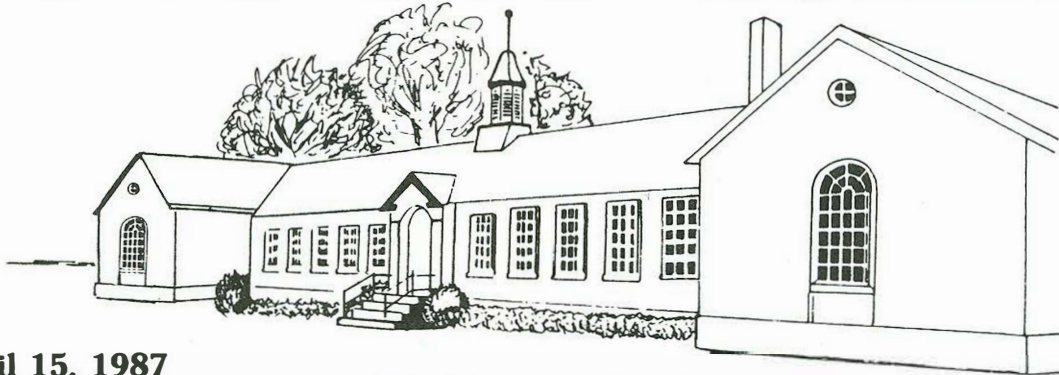

## Attention Cable TV Subscribers

Representatives from Viacom Cablevision will be on campus to pick up cable converter boxes. The schedule will be as follows:

### Thursday, April 23

10 a.m. to 3 p.m.—McGinnis Center

### Friday, April 24

10 a.m. to 3 p.m.—McGinnis Center

### Saturday, April 25

11 a.m. to 1 p.m.—343 E. Stewart, #1-B

### Monday, April 27

12 p.m. to 2 p.m.—McGinnis Center

The following is the procedure for disconnection of service for students:

- The cable boxes are returned at the designated times and locations. The **stop** billing date on the account is the actual date of return (students have the options of returning their boxes on any of four days).
- The disconnection orders are then entered into the computer. A pro-rated amount is computed to figure what the final bill will be according to the number of days the service was used and the monthly rate.
- If the bill for this month has been paid, the amount of the overpayment will be refunded to the student along with the \$50 deposit which was collected with service was installed. If the monthly bill has not been paid, the amount due for that month will be deducted from the \$50 deposit, and the difference will then be refunded to the student. **All** checks take approximately six to eight weeks to be processed and mailed. **\*\*It is important that we obtain a forwarding address in order to speed up the process of receiving the check. All checks are made out to the person whose name is on the account.**
- If disconnections of service is requested and the cable box is **not returned**, a charge of \$150 is placed on the account and **no** refund is issued.

As of April 16, 1987 additional dumpsters will be located throughout the off campus area for your convenience.
