Featured Marianist Mission

Another recipient of money collected for Marianists abroad this Lent will be the Marianist Sisters' Health Clinics in Kpatchile, Togo, West Africa and Singhpur, Jharkhand, India. Chaminade Health Care Center in India was dedicated in September 2012 to serve the students and families of the rural parish and the Marianist School. In October 2011, the Marianist Sisters opened a Rural Health Care Center in Kpatchile, Togo outside of Kara. Part of its mission is to provide maternity and well-baby care for people who previously had no medical assistance. The Sisters need help raising Sr. Ann Martine's salary and that of the other medical personnel who serve the rural poor.

Anointing of the Sick Tuesday, March 8 at 5pm in the Chapel

I recently had a family member who was about to have major surgery and when I asked if she wanted to be anointed (as in the Sacrament of the Sick) she exclaimed, "I'm not dying!" This was true, but a common misunderstanding of the purpose of this Sacrament. People are anointed with the Oil of the Sick to receive a special grace of healing and comfort, and to invite God into this process. This may occur when a person has an upcoming surgery, received a difficult diagnosis, or is experiencing ongoing health struggles. No one needs to share their affliction to be anointed and a person may be anointed multiple times in their life. All are welcome.
