RCIA: It's Our Responsibility

"The initiation of adults is the responsibility of all the baptized...Hence, the entire community must help the candidates and the catechumens throughout the process of initiation" (RCIA, 9).

The entire University of Dayton community of believers plays an important role in the RCIA process. Through your witness, encouragement, prayer, and hospitality our RCIA participants feel embraced and supported by our community. Your discipleship models the love of Christ for them. As a member of the community, you are invited to pray for the RCIA participants who will enter more deeply on their journey of faith through the Rites of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens and Welcoming the Candidates at the 10 AM mass on Sunday, November 15. Those journeying in faith towards the Easter sacraments include:

The catechumen is preparing for all three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. The catechumens celebrate the Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens. The candidates share with us in the Christian life through their baptism and are continuing to listen to God's call in their lives to discern entrance into full communion in the Roman Catholic Church. The candidates celebrate the Rite of Welcoming the Candidates.

What does faith offer *you*? How are you living out your baptism today? How do the riches of our Catholic tradition nourish your relationship with God? These are good questions for all of us to consider along with our candidates and catechumens.


