APRIL 12, "COMMUNITY DAY" ACTIVITIES FOR CURRAN INSTALLATION: "DAN CURRAN'S TOP TEN THINGS TO DO TO BUILD COMMUNITY"

"Community Day" on Saturday, April 12, caps off three days of special events surrounding the installation of Daniel J. Curran as the University of Dayton's 18th president.

Here are the times when Curran is expected to be at some of the sites. To track him down on Saturday morning, call Amy Lopez, co-chair of the installation committee, at 469-5517.

9 a.m.: Wheels for Kids, Kettering Labs parking lot (parking lot C). First-year engineering students team with Dayton-area children to repair bikes that they will take home.

9:30 a.m.: National Alumni Association Easter Egg Hunt, Kennedy Union Lawn. More than 250 children of UD alumni are expected to participate.

10 a.m.: Habitat RUN! For Humanity, Stuart Hall basketball courts. Curran is the official starter for the race, which benefits Habitat for Humanity.

10:30 a.m.: GreenSweep, McGinnis Center, 301 Lowes St. Student Government Association-sponsored clean-up of the student neighborhood.

11 a.m.: Rebuilding Together Dayton House Prep. Volunteers will scrape, power wash and prime a house at 216 Fountain St. for painting. Sponsored by the Fitz Center for Leadership in Community.

Curran, a sociologist and the first lay president in UD's 153-year history, is deeply committed to civic engagement and social justice.
