The Marian Library Gallery has been taken back to the early 20th century and transformed into an Art Nouveau haven. In his illustrations and ephemera, the artist Ezio Anichini depicts the many roles of the Blessed Virgin Mary; brings children's literature to life; and captures Italy's classical roots and emerging national identity. Together, the works demonstrate the power of graphic design to convey devotion, imagination and national pride and ideology.

Two highlights of this exhibit are *Litanie della Madonna*, a rare book in the Marian Library collections containing Litany of Loreto imagery by Anichini, along with two intricately embroidered reproductions of Anichini illustrations in gold thread, filoselle and fine floss, on loan from the Royal School of Needlework in England. The majority of the exhibit draws from the private collection and independent research of John A. Shaffer.
