George B. Hutchinson, supervisor of production engineering, Armco Drainage and Metal Products, Middletown, will be one of eight speakers at the University of Dayton's second annual conference on state and local government to be held on the campus Apr. 7.

More than 100 city, county, village and township officials and interested citizens from the Miami Valley area are expected at the one-day conference.

In his present position, Hutchinson coordinates the production activities of the company's 55 fabricating plants. An important part of his duties includes the analyzing of possible locations for new Armco Drainage plants.

He will speak at the conference at a 2:15 p.m. session on "Community Assets in the Location of New Industry."

Other speakers include William H. Book, executive vice president of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce; Harold Waddel, deputy director of highways for right-of-way, Columbus; James Maleon, director of research and statistics, Ohio Department of Taxation; Dr. John C. Bollens, executive director, Dayton Metropolitan Community Studies; Homer E. Dowdy, staff writer, the Flint (Mich.) Journal and John D. Corcoran, associate director, Public Administration Service, Chicago.
