DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL:

The Executive Committee of the Academic Senate recommends that the Senate endorse the attached "Statement on Dignity" and ask the Provost to request that it appear as a statement of principle in all relevant University publications, including the *Student Handbook*, the *Staff Handbook*, and the *Faculty Handbook*. The Executive Committee also recommends that the Senate seek endorsements of this statement from the Student Government Association, the Student Life Council, the Human Resources Committee, Professional Office Personnel, the Employee Union, the Research Institute, the local chapter of the AAUP, the Association for Women, and the Faculty Board. The Executive Committee believes that extensive discussion of the "Statement on Dignity" should provide a significant opportunity to educate the entire University community on the respectful treatment of all people.

Statement on Dignity

Every person at the University of Dayton shall be treated with respect and dignity. No person shall be subject to any sexual, racial, psychological, physical, verbal, or other similar harassment or abuse.
