John T. Arsenault was born January 23, 1904, in Saint Louis, Prince Edward Island, Canada. His seminary studies were in Worcester, Massachusetts, and Baltimore, Maryland. He was ordained on June 14, 1930 at Saint Andre parish in Biddeford, Maine, by Bishop John Gregory Murray. He served as a pastor in many different parishes throughout the state of Maine. He was named a monsignor (domestic prelate) in 1963. He retired from active priestly ministry on September 15, 1968. He died on August 26, 1974.
