**AWARD-WINNING AUTHOR AND EDITORIAL COLUMNIST PAUL GREENBERG
 WILL SPEAK ON TERRORISM AND AMERICAN POLICIES IN FREE LECTURE**

DAYTON, Ohio — Pulitzer Prize-winning editorialist Paul Greenberg will discuss how the war against terror has affected American policies and conflict in the Middle East in "Terrorism: Myths and Realities," a free lecture sponsored by the University of Dayton Library Advancement Association. The lecture will be at 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 17, in the Dayton Marriott Hotel ballroom, 1414 S. Patterson Blvd.

A dessert reception and book signing will be held in the Marriott's Tradewinds Pavilion immediately following Greenberg's talk. Although the lecture is free and open to the public, there is a \$15 charge for admission to the reception. Reservations for the reception must be made by Oct. 10. Earlier in the day, Greenberg will spend time with communication students in class.

Greenberg, who currently serves as the editorial page editor for the *Arkansas Democrat-Gazette*, is an award-winning essayist and critic widely recognized for his conservative and in-depth coverage of President Clinton. He is the author of *No Surprises: Two Decades of Clinton-Watching* (Brassey's 1996) and several other books, including the critically acclaimed *Resonant Lives* (University Press of America, 1991) and *Entirely Personal* (University Press of Mississippi, 1992).

Greenberg's editorial column is distributed three times a week by the Los Angeles Times Syndicate, and he regularly provides political analysis on Arkansas television and in lectures across the country.

He was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for editorial writing in 1969 and was a finalist for the award in 1978 and 1986. He is also the recipient of a number of other awards for writing, including the William Allen White Award, the Arkansas Associated Press Editorial Writing Award, the H.L. Mencken Award, the University of Missouri School of Journalism Medal of Honor, the American Society of Newspaper Editors' Distinguished Writing Award for Commentary, the Grenville Clark Editorial Award and two Walker Stone awards.

Greenberg has served on the board of the National Conference of Editorial Writers and was a Pulitzer jurist in 1984 and 1985.

Born and raised in Shreveport, La., Greenberg earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in journalism and history at the University of Missouri and did additional postgraduate work at Columbia University. He taught history at Hunter College in New York and at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff.

In 1985 he was a visiting Fulbright Fellow in Soviet-American relations at the University of Arkansas at Fayetteville. Greenberg worked as editorial page editor for the *Pine Bluff Commercial* in Arkansas from 1962 to 1966 and again from 1967 to 1992. In 1966-67 he was an editorial writer for the *Chicago Daily News*.

Greenberg currently resides in Little Rock with his wife, Carolyn, and two children.
