Today's Gospel story shows us that Jesus does not want to condemn us, but to put us on the path to new life in him. Our prayer, fasting, learning and giving with Operation Rice Bowl opens paths to new life for our brothers and sisters in need.



## ROMERO

"Peace is the generous, tranquil contribution of all to the good of all. Peace is dynamism. Peace is generosity. It is right and it is duty." For words like these, Archbishop Oscar Romero was shot in the chest while presiding at Mass.

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God... Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when men revile you, and persecute you and say all kinds of evil against you falsely on account of Me." For words like these, Jesus the Christ was persecuted by Jewish leaders and crucified by the Roman state.

Both men's lives ended in violence but their words of peace and justice were not silenced. When we offer the Peace of Christ to one another at Mass we are being challenged by them – do we believe in those words or is it just another awkward handshake and smile?

On March 24, the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Romero's death, you are invited to join Pax Christi for a Stations of the Cross around campus, starting in Nazareth Courtyard at 11:55am.

The Archbishop Oscar Romero Human Rights Award Ceremony and Symposium will be held March 28-March 30. Events include a screening of the film "Romero" on Sunday, March 28 at 4:30pm in Sears, the presentation of the Romero Award to the US Bishop Office of Migration and Refugee Services on Monday, March 29 at 7pm in the Chapel and a symposium on "Social Inquiry for Social Justice" on Tuesday, March 30 at 7pm in Boll Theatre.

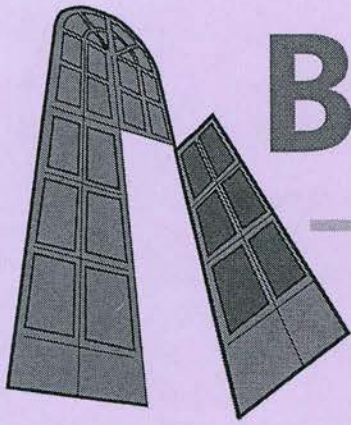

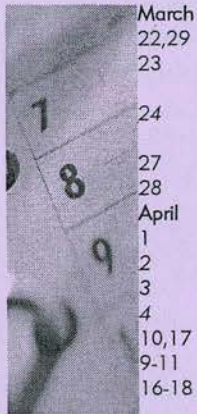
