

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LEAD

There is great power in numbers. The Book of Nehemiah shows this clearly as the Israelites, by gathering to speak as one voice, got their government to change policies that were unjust for the poor. LEAD is a local organization of faith communities that does the same thing here in Dayton. Because of LEAD's past successes on issues such as predatory lending and substance abuse treatment, the UD faith community has decided to join this ecumenical group and boost its numbers so that more positive change will happen for God's people in need.

This year's "Nehemiah Action" will call on business and political leaders 1) to make public transportation more affordable and accessible for low-income families, and 2) to increase funding for a very successful program that rehabilitates rather than incarcerates juvenile drug users.

But we need numbers! Reaching the goal of 1,300 people from LEAD's 20 faith communities to come to **Immaculate Conception Church** (2300 S. Smithville Rd.) on **Monday, April 19 at 6:30pm** will go a long way towards convincing the decision-makers who come to the Action that changes need to be made for the common good. 
