Re: Adjunct Faculty Status Policy

As you know, we previously forwarded to you a one paragraph proposal for an Adjunct Faculty Status Policy. After feedback from the deans, the committee has voted 6-0-0 to add another paragraph of clarification. We hereby forward to you the total proposal for consideration by the Senate.

The Adjunct Professor rank is awarded to a part-time faculty member whose prestige and dedication provide a significant benefit to the University. The adjunct status is awarded by the Provost at the recommendation of the Chairperson and the Dean. The rank of Adjunct Professor is a part-time appointment without tenure. The appointment does not carry with it any additional benefits or faculty privileges beyond those available to other part-time faculty.

Individual Schools or the College can draw up their own criteria. Adjunct status does not imply appointment for a particular length of time. Once an appointment is made, there will be no regular updates and the appointment is in force until taken away.
