Carm., Washington, has contributed a survey of Marian books as chosen by outstanding authors and scholars of the U.S. A study of Marian periodicals, by Brother John J. Drerup, S.M., Dayton, will also appear in the May issue.

MARIAN REPRINTS

INEFFABILIS DEUS, the apostolic letter of Pope Pius IX defining the dogma of the Immaculate Conception (1854), has just been published in a new translation as *Marian Reprint* #23. The translation from the original Latin has been made by Rev. Philip C. Hoelle, S.M., of the Religion Department of the University of Dayton.

A new translation of AD DIEM ILLUM, written by Pope Pius X on the fiftieth anniversary of the defining of the Immaculate Conception (1904), will appear as *Marian Reprint* #25 in May.

These two reprints, together with FULGENS CORONA, encyclical letter of Pope Pius XII proclaiming the Marian Year in honor of the one hundredth anniversary (1953), (*Marian Reprint* #20), provide the texts of the three most important papal documents on the Immaculate Conception.
