SECOND MARIAN INSTITUTE

• WHAT IS THE INSTITUTE?

The institute is a three-day program of lectures, study, and discussions about the Blessed Virgin. It is designed to enable you to know Mary better, and as a result, to love and serve her better. The specific purpose of the 1954 institute is to provide an opportunity to study the meaning and implications of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady in our day.

• WHAT IS THE PLAN?

Each day of the institute is planned as a complete unit in itself. The first day (Thursday, June 10) will be devoted to a general study of the Immaculate Conception, with talks by Father Juniper Carol, O.F.M., Brother John Totten, S.M., and Father Charles Lees, S.M. The second day (Friday, June 11) is planned with teachers particularly in mind. The relationship of the Immaculate Conception to Christian Education will be stressed. Speakers for this day include Sister Mary Jean Dorcy, O.P., Brother Louis Faerber, S.M., Rev. Charles Blum, and Rev. John Dickson, S.M. The third day (Saturday, June 12) is especially slanted towards the apostolate, and will feature talks by Rev. Edward Kotter, Rev. Stanley Kusman, S.M., and a representative of Grailville.

• WHO IS INVITED?

All those interested in the Blessed Virgin — priests, religious, and laity. A very special invitation is extended to all Priests, Brothers, Sisters, and Laymen of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Last year we were happy to welcome visitors from six states to the First Marian Institute.

• WHAT ARE THE EXPENSES?

Registration fee, \$5.00 for the entire institute (three days); \$2.00 per day for single days. Meals will be served in the university cafeteria at a nominal cost. Housing accommodations will be provided on the campus for men. Housing arrangements will be made on request for Sisters and other women visitors.

A MARIOLOGICAL SYMPOSIUM AT NOTRE DAME

The University of Notre Dame will be host to a theological Symposium on the Immaculate Conception, from June 30th to July 2, this summer. Prominent theologians from both this country and from abroad will convene to discuss the dogma. One of the principal speakers will be Rev. Carlo Balic, O. F. M. president of the International Marian Academy, at Rome. He will speak on "The Theology of the Immaculate Conception from the 9th to 13th Century." Father Balic will also give a series of lectures on Mariology at Notre Dame during the period immediately before and after the Symposium.

Among other speakers will be Rev. Urban Mullaney O. P., of Washington; Rev. Sebastian, O. F. M. of Edmonton, Canada. Dr. Charles DeKoninck of Quebec, Rev. Joseph Montalvane, O. F. M., of Lisbon, Portugal.

This Symposium is one of a series of events, including lectures, art exhibits, and a medieval play on the Annunciation. The culmination of these celebrations will come on December 8th. in a solemn rededication of the University to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

McLoughlin, O.P. (Winston) is a simple life of the Blessed Virgin. with a selection on her more important shrines. . . . Rev. T. N. Jorgensen's new pamphlet LIVE the ROSARY WITH JOACHIM, JOSEPH AND JOHN was published by the Queen's Work Press in May 1954.

MARY IN OUR LIFE

One of the most important contributions to American Mariology has recently been made with the publication of MARY IN OUR LIFE by Rev. William G. Most, Loras College, Dubuque, Iowa. It is published by Kenedy. Father Most has written an integrated study of doctrine and devotion which will serve well as a college text in Mariology, as well as a guide for study clubs or private study and reading.

Father Juniper Carol, O.F.M., founder of the Mariological Society of America praises Father Most's book in these words: "Even the professional theologian will find here a remarkable example of how to bring subtle and technical questions down to the level of the uninitiated in an accurate yet attractive manner."
