DAYTON, O., June 14. -- Fr. Juniper B. Carol, O.F.M.,
founder and first president of the Mariological Society of America,
has been named winner of the 1957 Marian Library medal for his book,
Fundamentals of Mariology.

The announcement was made here today by Fr. Philip C.
Hoelle, S.M., director of the Marian Library at the University of
Dayton, at the opening session of the fifth Marian Institute on the
campus.

Fr. Carol, presently stationed at St. Bonaventure Monas-
tery, Paterson, N.J., is the editor of Marian Studies, the publication
of the Mariological Society, and is a member of the Pontifical
Academy of Mariology.

In 1950, Fr. Carol became the first winner of the
University of Dayton's annual Marianist Award for his outstanding
contribution to the promotion of the study of Mariology in the United
States.

A native of Havana, Cuba, Fr. Carol studied at the
Catholic University of America in Washington and at several European
universities. He received his doctorate in sacred theology at the
Antonianum. He is internationally known as an expert on the
Co-Redemption of the Blessed Virgin, and his book, De Corredemptione
B. V. Mariae, is considered the best work on the subject. He is at
present editing a three-volume series, Mariology, which contains the
works of outstanding American scholars.

Marian Library medal to Fr. Carol -- 2

The Marian Library medal is awarded each year for the book written in English and published in the United States which will do most to promote knowledge, and as a result, love and service of the Blessed Virgin.

Previous winners were Bishop Fulton J. Sheen (The World's First Love) in 1953, Msgr. John S. Kennedy (Light on the Mountain) in 1954, Rev. William G. Most (Mary in Our Life) in 1955, and Mrs. Ruth Cranston (The Miracle of Lourdes) in 1956.

Fr. Carol's award-winning book, published by Benziger, has been praised by reviewers as the best brief outline of doctrine ever written by an American author. A Dictionary of Mary, by the English scholar Donald Attwater, received an honorable mention in the judging.

The Marian Library was founded at the Society of Mary's University of Dayton in 1943 as an international center for research on the Blessed Virgin Mary. It has grown into one of the largest Mariological centers in the world.
