DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL: State objectives, rationale, and how proposal is to be implemented

Update definitions of Distinguished Service Professor and Professor Emeritus which are found in the Faculty Handbook, Section D-5.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE PROFESSOR
(Current Description)

The title Distinguished Service Professor may be awarded to an individual currently a member of the faculty who has contributed long years of service to the University and who has demonstrated truly exceptional service to the University community as a teacher, as a researcher, or as an academic administrator. Any member of the University academic community may nominate a candidate for the title Distinguished Service Professor. Normally the nomination should originate through department channels but in rare cases the nomination may be made to the appropriate Dean or the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost. The title is conferred by the President upon the recommendation of the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE PROFESSOR
(Revised Description)

The title Distinguished Service Professor may be awarded to a current member of the faculty who has contributed long years of exceptional service to the University community as either a teacher, a researcher, or an academic administrator. Any member of the University academic community may nominate a candidate for the title Distinguished Service Professor. The nomination should originate at the department level and be directed to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost through the appropriate Dean. The title is conferred by the President upon the recommendation of the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost.

EMERITUS (EMERITA)
(Current Description)

The title Emeritus (Emerita) may be conferred on a person who has retired from full-time teaching or administration. The title is granted in recognition of long or exceptional service as shown through the person's teaching or administrative ability, and dedication to the University and to the teaching profession. The recommendation is submitted by the Department, through the Dean, to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost. The President confers the title. Faculty members who have the title Emeritus (Emerita) retain their faculty status and the academic rank which they held at the time of retirement. They are listed in the official Faculty Roster, may attend faculty and department meetings as non-voting members, and, in general, are afforded the academic privileges of faculty status.

EMERITUS (EMERITA)
(Revised Description)

The title Emeritus (Emerita) may be conferred on a person who has retired from full-time teaching or administration. The title is granted in recognition of exceptional service, as shown through the person's accomplishments in teaching, scholarship and/or service, and dedication to the University and to the teaching profession. The recommendation is submitted by the Department, through the Dean, to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost. The President confers the title. Faculty members who have the title Emeritus (Emerita) retain their faculty status and the academic rank which they held at the time of retirement. They are listed in the the official Faculty Roster, may attend faculty and department meetings as non-voting members, and, in general, are afforded the academic privileges of faculty status.
