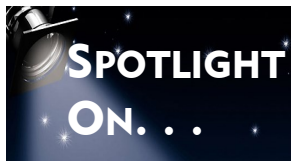

Sukkot is a Jewish Holiday that literally means “The Feast of Booths” or shelters. Following the somber holiday of Yom Kippur, Sukkot is a joyful Jewish celebration with both historical and agricultural significance. It commemorates the forty-year period during which the children of Israel were wandering the desert, living in temporary shelters. Agriculturally, it is a harvest festival as well. Come out on the 17th to support your fellow Jewish students on campus, get some free food, and also learn more about this Jewish holiday!

You might be asking yourself now, “What is the purpose of celebrating holidays that aren’t mine?” In the Christian and Catholic tradition, we have so many holidays to celebrate already. 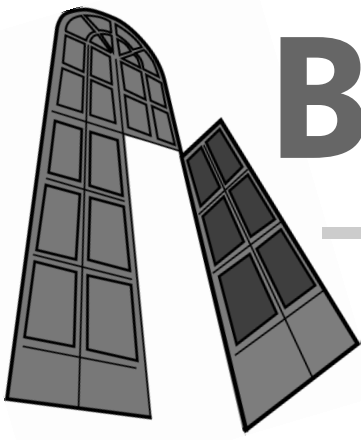
