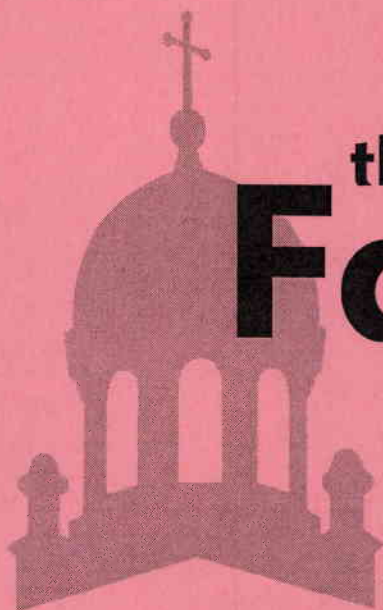

## A Language of Love

In today's Gospel, we hear that the greatest commandment is to love the Lord God with all our heart, soul, and mind. As we prepare for the full introduction of the third edition of the Roman Missal, we are given a rare opportunity to make our heart, soul, and mind a fertile home for the prayers of the liturgy. It is the liturgy that allows us to express our love for God in union with the entire Church.

In just a few short weeks, our ears will hear a new expression of love for God. These are simply a novel way of expressing the timeless truths we proclaim during Mass. While it may seem foreign to our American ears, the new translations provide us with an occasion to reflect on our unity with Catholics throughout the world. There will be a unified English translation used by all English-speaking Catholics, and the translation attempts to bring us closer in union with all other language groups.

Love eludes language. Poets have attempted throughout the ages to capture the depth and beauty of love in words. How great, then, is the challenge to describe the indescribable mysteries of the faith? As the Church makes its own human attempt to depict these awesome wonders, may we pray that—together in faith—we might be open to these new expressions of love present in our liturgy.

## Missal, Mass and Mission

What else is different about the Creed?

Replacing the words "seen and unseen," the new translation states "of all things visible and invisible," drawing us to the true mysterious nature of creation. It is not dependent on our sight, but a spiritual reality, made by God. Two additional new phrases are "only begotten Son" and "born of the Father before all ages." These texts are a reflection on the unique relationship between Father and Son. This is not magic; it is relationship.

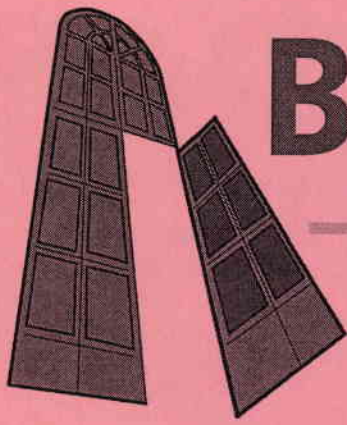
