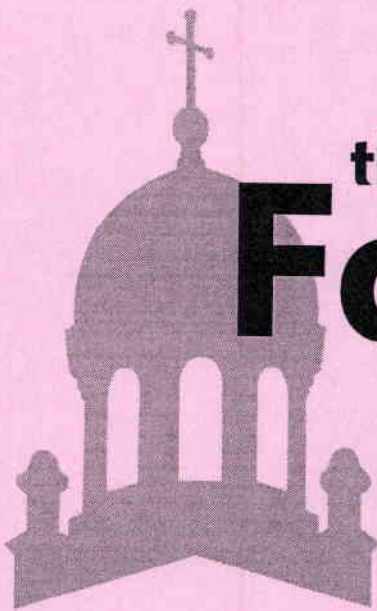

Saints

The Feast of All Saints is a feast of joy ...a feast of friends in the Lord. After all, the saints are the friends of God; they share God's life. In our own lives of grace, we too are God's beloved. We belong to the Reign of Love together with those who have already passed from this life to the next. They know our struggles, our sorrows, our needs because they have gone through their own purification when on earth. Each one valued their baptismal calling and lived it out according to their own gifts and talents and God's call.

Just as sometimes we have friends that are similar to us, so too do we have friends among the Communion of Saints. Many people look to their patron saints because the patron had some human quality or some experience that makes us feel closer to them. If you are a barber you might pray to St. Martin de Porres who used to cut the hair of the brothers in his community. If you are a banker or accountant you could look to St. Matthew who started out as a tax collector.

If you don't know any saint, you could meet some new ones and entrust some of your concerns to someone with whom you can feel a connection. If you want to meet some new saints, try looking for a book about saints, like Robert Ellsberg's book, *All Saints*.

Tuesday, **November 1** is All Saints Day and a holy day of obligation. All Saints solemnity honors the holy men and women of every time and place who rejoice in God's presence. Mass will be celebrated at **12:05pm, 4:30pm, and 9pm** in the Immaculate Conception Chapel.

Why are the words "consubstantial" and "incamate" being included in the Creed, and why was "he suffered death" added?

"Consubstantial with the Father" emphasizes the unutterably fundamental oneness in nature between the Father and Son, and is a direct translation of the Latin phrase. "Incarnate of the Virgin Mary" indicates the truth of the Son taking on our fleshly existence in Mary's womb. "He suffered death" is a part of the new text attesting that Jesus suffered the ultimate loss, real death, which was overcome by the reality of his resurrection.

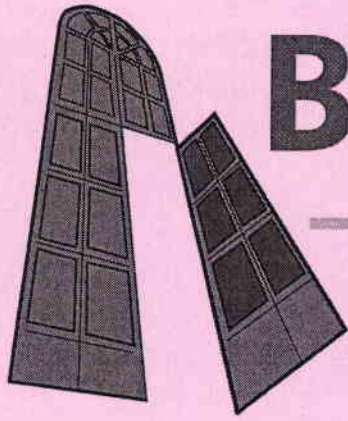
