When People are Gathered

We are now one week away from full implementation of the Roman Missal, third edition, which is the collection of prayers, chants, and instructions used when we celebrate liturgy together.

Some have compared the implementation to the lukewarm reception of the recent, new version of Facebook by its users—why was it changed? Others have compared it to the shock new parents experience in caring for their new baby—nothing read or said really prepares for the demands of a helpless infant.

Whatever your metaphor may be, the Roman Missal Implementation Group has prayed for a renewed understanding of the liturgy and call to full, conscious, and active participation.

This group of fifteen faculty, staff, and students first met in February 2011 to create a plan to assist our community in learning about the revisions. It seemed like a monumental and sometimes overwhelming task, but with the support, time and energy from all its members, the work is complete. And our “work” at Mass begins...

The first two words of the Order of Mass from before the Second Vatican Council were: “When the priest is ready...” The Order of Mass now begins, “When the people are gathered...” This shift in focus to the vital presence of the community is no accident. As we gather together, next Sunday and beyond, may our minds and hearts be open to the presence of Christ in each other, the Word of God, and the Eucharist.

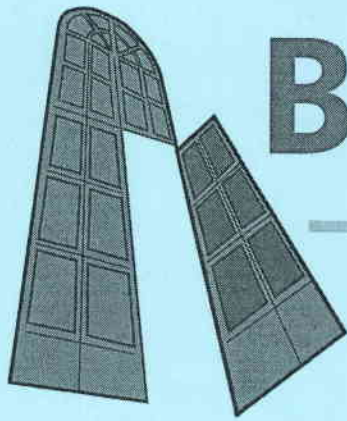
