Creating Inclusive Community

The University of Dayton will hold its annual 2017 Creating Inclusive Community Conference from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 21, in the Jesse Philips Humanities Center.

Speakers include:

* University of Dayton President Eric Spina, who will provide opening remarks and discuss the important role all members of the UD community play in creating an inclusive community on campus.

* University of Dayton Vice President for Diversity and Inclusion Larry Burnley, who will give a presentation on the importance of engaging in diverse experiences and dialogue on campus plus how the University can create more of these opportunities inside and outside of the classroom.

* Martha Hurley, University of Dayton director of criminal justice studies, who will talk about the effect of private prisons. She will show a brief documentary — "Prisons For Profit" — that examines the first 18 months after the Corrections Corporation of America purchased the Lake Erie Correctional Institution in 2011 from the state of Ohio.

* Emily Anstaett and Sarah Ingles, law clerks with the American Civil Liberties Union of Ohio, who will discuss free speech and the rights of protestors.

* University of Dayton Diversity Peer Educators kick off the conference with an introduction to dialogue.

The conference, a student-led initiative supported by the University of Dayton offices of the provost and student development, is free and open to the public. It is a project of the Creative Inclusive Community mini-course taught by associate English professor Tom Morgan and Patty Alvarez, assistant dean of students and director of multicultural affairs.
