The University of Dayton is seeking comments from the public about the University in preparation for its periodic evaluation by its regional accrediting agency. The University will host a visit Feb. 12-13 with a team representing the Higher Learning Commission. The University of Dayton has been accredited by HLC since 1928. The team will review the institution's ongoing ability to meet HLC's Criteria for Accreditation. The public may also submit comments on HLC's website. Comments must address substantive matters related to the quality of the institution or its academic programs. Comments must be in writing. NEW HAMPSHIRE U.S. SENATOR TO SPEAK AT SCHOOL OF LAW OCT. 27

U.S. Sen. Maggie Hassan from New Hampshire will speak noon to 1 p.m. Friday, Oct. 27, at the University of Dayton School of Law. It is free and open to the public, but seating is limited. Parking passes will be available at the visitors booth on University Circle. The title of Hassan's talk is "Learning from those around you: the qualities that can help you succeed in your career and as a citizen." Sen. Hassan will address how civic engagement and learning from others' experiences are fundamental duties for every American. She also will discuss how our shared challenges, like the substance misuse crisis, impact the United States. Hassan first served in the New Hampshire senate in 2004 and her peers soon selected her as president pro tempore and majority

Professional Development Programs

Oct. 24: "Problem Solving for Team Leaders: Lean Six Sigma Yellow Belt." Participants will gain the knowledge and skills to lead Lean Six Sigma problem solving teams through the five-step Lean Six Sigma Problem Solving process. The one-day yellow belt workshop is a prerequisite for this program.

The cost for a professional development program is \$395 for the general public, \$345 for University of Dayton alumni and \$299 for center partners.

Executive Development Programs

Oct. 25: "Heart-Led Leader: Defining Your Leadership Philosophy" (morning session) and "Return on Relationship: Building Deeper, More Authentic Connections" (afternoon session) with Tommy Spaulding, a world-renowned speaker on leadership, and *New York Times* and *Wall Street Journal* best-selling author. The morning session is geared toward developing a leadership philosophy to drive bottom-line results, understanding humility, vulnerability, transparency, empathy and love and discovering how to incorporate your heart into your career to manage others and live your life. The afternoon session is geared toward understanding why return on relationships is the new currency driving return on investment, creating a relationship game plan and implementing tools to build relationship capital and results.
