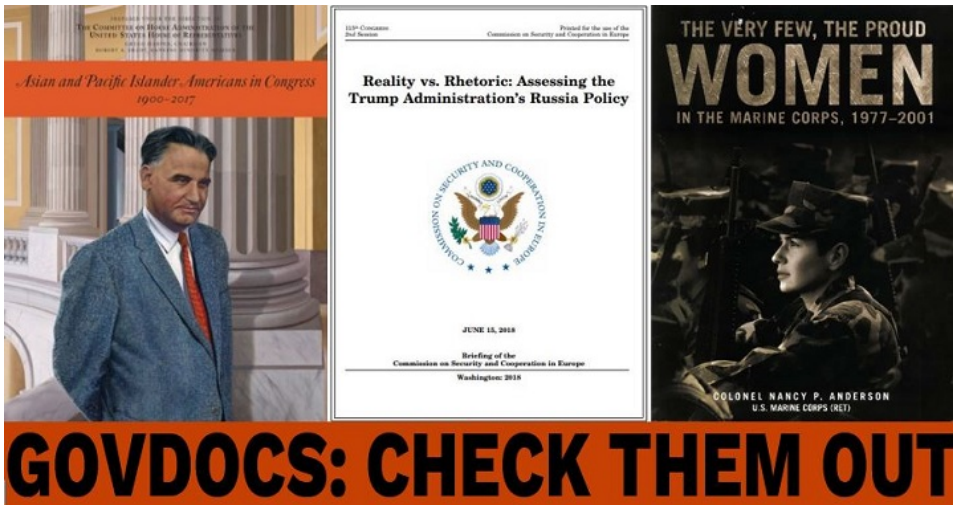

Asian and Pacific Islander Americans in Congress, 1900-2017

By the Office of the Historian and Office of the Clerk, U.S. House of Representatives

This substantial publication provides not only a detailed history of Asian and Pacific Islander participation in the U.S. Congress, but also a profile of each delegate up to the present day. The first is Robert W. Wilcox representing the territory of Hawaii in 1900. Interestingly, Hawaiian independence was the centerpiece of his efforts. Lots of pictures and interesting details make this an easy book to browse.

This March 2018 hearing primarily focused on what needed to happen in the restoration of power and water to Puerto Rico following Hurricane Maria in 2017. In addition, the subcommittee discussed how to be better prepared for the next hurricane season. Witnesses represented the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the Department of Energy, the Environmental Protection Agency, Edison Electric Institute, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Hearing of the Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions, U.S. Senate

This July 2016 hearing was inspired by the sexual assault of a Stanford University student. The opening statement recognized the disagreement in Congress about the role of the federal government in this area but initiated a discussion of the need to ensure that college campuses provide safe learning environments for all students.

Witnesses represented Security Risk Management Consultants, StopHazing.org, Washington State University, DeSales University, SUNY-Albany and the Tyler Clementi Foundation.

In addition, letters were submitted from Amnesty International and various civil rights groups in California.

Witnesses came from the Foundation for Research on Equal Opportunity, the Heritage Foundation, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, and the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities.
