THE MARIAN LIBRARY/THE INTERNATIONAL MARIAN RESEARCH INSTITUTE

THE MARIAN LIBRARY, established at the University of Dayton in 1943, is today one of the world's largest and most comprehensive collections of printed materials on Mary, Mother of God and all the faithful, and related fields. Holdings include books and pamphlets in over 50 languages (dating from the 15th century to the present), as well as various collections of other Marian materials (statues, prints, music, slides, postcards, Christmas cards, Nativity sets, stamps, medals, recordings, audio- and videotapes, CDs, and DVDs). The special collections of the Marian Library are complemented by the resources available in Roesch Library of the University of Dayton, a member of the OhioLINK library consortium.

THE INTERNATIONAL MARIAN RESEARCH INSTITUTE (IMRI), founded in 1975, is affiliated with the Pontifical Theological Faculty Marianum (Rome). IMRI exists to facilitate and encourage Marian studies in the U.S.A. and abroad, to mine the wealth of the Marian Library and make it available to students through a regular academic program. IMRI is empowered to bestow the licentiate (S.T.L.) and the doctorate (S.T.D.) of sacred theology, with specialization in mariology. Students may also earn a certificate in Marian Studies or a master's degree in religious studies, with specialization in mariology, from the Department of Religious Studies at the University of Dayton (offered in a joint program). IMRI also offers a program of Guided Studies and accepts auditors to the academic program. Some student scholarships are available, as are fellowships for scholars engaged in independent research.
