DAYTON -- University of Dayton's observance of its silver anniversary of coeducation swings into high gear this week as it hosts the 10th anniversary meeting of the Ohio Student Personnel Conference.

Dean of Women R. Kathleen Whetro will be general chairman for the meeting, set for Friday (March 4). She said UD's sponsoring of the annual meeting is one of several events during the current semester calling attention to 25 years of coeducation at the university.

It was in 1935 that women were first admitted to UD as full-time students.

The conference will be devoted to "student personnel problems arising from mounting costs of education," Dean Whetro said. Several student personnel officers from Ohio colleges are to take part in the day-long program.

To be discussed will be such topics as student employment on and off the campus; student aid, loans, scholarships; conflicts arising between studies and extra-curricular activities, and similar topics.
