One of the country's most prominent glacier geologists will lecture at the University of Dayton Thursday and on the following day will meet with area high school students interested in the field of geology as a career.

Dr. S. Sheldon Judson Jr., associate professor of geology at Princeton University, will speak on "The Geology and Paleolithic Archeology of the Dordogne Valley, France" at 8 p.m. Thursday in Room 216, Sherman Hall. The public lecture will be illustrated.

The Dordogne valley, located in south central France, was one of the principal habitats of the Stone Age man.

Dr. Judson will meet informally with high school students at 1:30 p.m. Friday in the same room, Sherman Hall 216. Students from all over the Miami Valley area have been invited.

A graduate of Princeton (1940) and Harvard, Dr. Judson taught at the University of Wisconsin before joining the Princeton faculty in 1955. He has a number of publications to his credit in addition to a text on geology currently being used at UD.

The Thursday evening lecture is free and the public is invited.
