Duke Ellington, the Kirby Stone Four, and the Al Belletto Sextet have been signed to appear at the University of Dayton student Council's annual spring week jazz concert.

Spring week is set for May 7-13 and the jazz portion of the festivities will take place in the fieldhouse at 8 p.m. on Wednesday, May 10.

This jazz show in the past has brought to Dayton the Dave Brubeck Quartet, the Hi-Lo's, Stan Kenton, and the Crew Cuts.

This is one of the biggest programs the students have arranged for their annual show. Duke Ellington, one of the all-time greats in the big band business, added another laurel to his collection in January when he played at one of the inaugural balls in Washington. His 15-piece orchestra will highlight the three-hour fieldhouse show.

The Kirby Stone Four, who've been guest stars on a number of network television shows recently, are known well in the Dayton area. They played the new Galaxy Night Club some weeks ago.

While the Al Belletto Sextet are primarily accompanists for the Kirby Stone group, they'll also do several numbers on their own during the UD show.

The UD student council, sponsors of the show, announced that all seats will be reserved for the program. In previous years, it was best seats for early arrivals. The new plan should be an improvement.
