The University of Dayton School of Law's 32nd Program in Law and Technology seminar June 9 will examine the roles of the military, higher education and government in fostering innovation ecosystems, especially in central and southwest Ohio.

James Bieryla, deputy director of AFWERX, a technology directorate of the Air Force Research Laboratory and the innovation arm of the Department of the U.S. Air Force, will be the keynote speaker.

In addition to focusing on military, higher education and governments; other sessions will examine issues civilian lawyers face in military patenting issues, patent advice for active and retired military and early stage legal advice for artists and musicians.

Other speakers include Deborah Davis-Brutchen, an intellectual property manager at the Air Force Research Lab; Scott Koorndyk, president of The Entrepreneurs Center in Dayton; and Joseph Zeis, aerospace and defense advisor for Ohio Gov. Mike DeWine.
