"Although the Universal Declaration of Human Rights is not new, many people are unaware of their fundamental rights as human beings," said Shelley Inglis, [University of Dayton Human Rights Center](#) executive director. "In addition to helping residents understand their human rights, we are seeking their input on how Dayton can become a 'Human Rights City,' a more engaged civic society working in partnership with city officials to become a 'Human Rights City' that uses a human rights lens to develop policies and practices."
