1. Approval of [minutes](#) from October 30.
 - a. No requested edits, motion to approve by Connie, seconded by Michael. Approval by all, including Jim Dunne who is absent from the meeting but indicated it ahead of time.
2. Discussion of the updated APC [revision](#) to the draft transfer credit policy.
 - a. We could include a note to make clear whether local bilateral is a subset of articulation.
 - b. Deb will clarify with Hideo whether we could use articulation instead of local bilateral.
 - c. Deb will also reach out to Lee Dixon about a proposed alternative to policy,g, and send a suggested change to the committee before the next meeting.
 - d. Andrew raised a question about policy “i,” and whether or not it is referring to translation between a quarter vs. semester system. Are numeric equivalents calculated? The statement in “i” could mean more than just quarter vs. semester; it could include the fact that one university might award more credits for a particular course because at that university, the course is more comprehensive, such as including a lab component, as an example. Two follow-up questions to this would be: do we use an established mathematical equation to express conversion of quarter system to semester? (like the DAGSI/UD conversion between quarter/semester to 2.66). Is “i” meant to capture both examples raised here?
 - e. We should say “first year first time” instead of first year (first time).
3. Discussion of the draft APC [report](#) to ECAS on the transfer credit policy. Tereza read a suggested addition provided ahead of time by Jim and all agreed it would be a good addition
