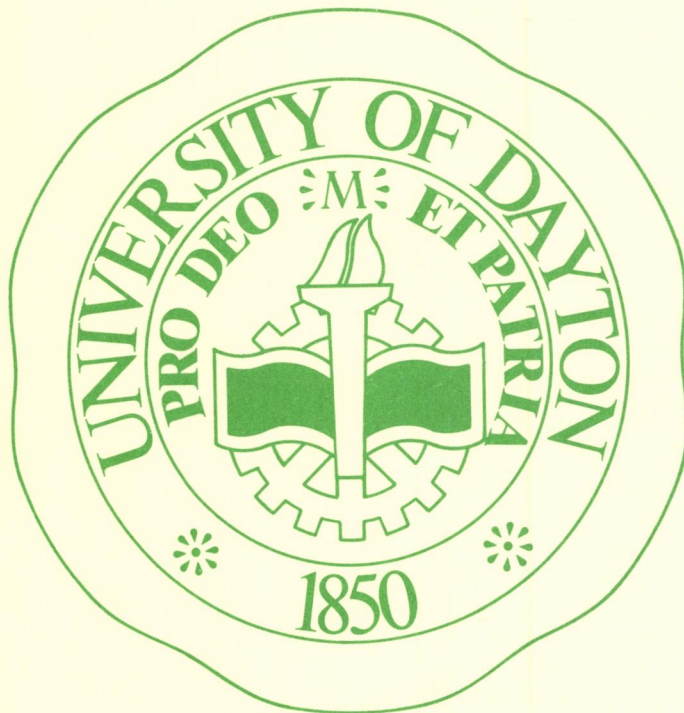

The *Review* is published irregularly, but usually three times a year by the University of Dayton, 300 College Park Avenue, Dayton, Ohio 45469. It is sent without charge to libraries and interested persons who request copies. (Those who request only special issues or back issues should include \$1.00/issue with their requests in order to cover the costs of handling and increased postage charges.) Manuscripts, correspondence and requests for subscriptions or copies should be sent to the Editor in care of the Department of Languages. Contributions should not normally exceed 6000 words in length and should follow the form prescribed in the *MLA Style Sheet*, with footnotes and indented quotations double-spaced.

*The University of Dayton Review* is indexed in the annual *Bibliography of the Modern Language Association of America* and in the *American Humanities index*, a quarterly index to scholarly, critical, and creative journals.
